Timothy joined our mentoring team last summer through our partnership with Edward Jones. Once a month, he and other Edward Jones mentors visit our partner school - Adams Elementary (SLPS) in the morning to work with students on enhancing their reading and writing skills, build self-esteem, and make meaningful connections that can lead to job-shadowing opportunities. The company also provides

transportation for their employees who volunteer as mentors. Although this is Tim's first year mentoring with our program, he has had a long history of supporting area youth via coaching and
