Youth of the Year

A proud O'Fallon Park Club member captured the 2022 Youth of the Year! Lailah Green received the highest honor a Boys & Girls Clubs member can achieve when she was named the 2022 Youth of the Year.

Youth of the Year is a signature Boys & Girls Clubs program celebrating members' contributions to their family, school, community, and Boys & Girls Club. Lailah proudly accepted the Youth of the Year honor at the Jerseys & Jewels-themed, drive-in tailgate-styled Great Futures Gala. The Gala is the organization's largest fundraising event. The event raised \$700,000 for Club kids and teens!

Fifteen-year-old Lailah is a sophomore at Metro Academic and Classical High School and has been a member of the O'Fallon Park Club for eight years. Lailah also received the Michael & Wanda DeHaven \$5,000 Scholarship, a celebratory dinner courtesy of the Saint Louis Club, and a car provided by Frank Leta Honda!

She plans to pursue higher education, hoping to one day become a Congresswoman. Lailahd credits the supportive Club staff with helping her find the light at the end of the tunnel and multiple programs for allowing her to turn around her behavior and lend a hand when she needed it most. She says the Club has "helped her love herself, gain confidence, gain leadership skills, and make long-lasting friendships."

Highlights

Mathews-Dickey Club (MDC) enjoyed solid med bership numbers and continued legacy events in 2022. The St. Louis Fire Department raised more than \$20,000 for summer camp programs during their annual Memorial Day Fill the Boot campaign. The dedication to support MDC is unmatched.

Firefighters collected donations at various intersections throughout the city in between answering emergency calls.

The MDC summer camp program also received a lift from SSM Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital, which donated breakfast and a hot lunch for the eight-week session. SSM's donation totaled more than **\$21,000**, feeding nearly **150 members**.

The Homecoming football tradition attracted **725** families participating in the tailgate party. A sports leader, MDC teams captured several divisional and State championships in football, softball, and baseball and retains a reputation for providing elite golf and tennis programs.

Pemembering the Life & Legacy of Mathews—Dickey co-founder MARTIN MATHEWS

In 2022, youth development lost one of its strongest Advocates with the passing of Mathew's Dickey co-founder Martin L. Mathews, affectionately referred to as Mr. Mathews.

Mr. Mathews died on Tuesday, November 8, 2022. He was 97. Mathews-Dickey Boys & Girls Clubs began in 1960 when Mathews met with Hubert "Dickey" Ballentine in Handy Park, a few blocks east of Kingshighway and south of Natural Bridge. Both men were talented former semi-pro baseball players and believed education and character development were paths to success. Mr. Mathews said sports taught youth teamwork and discipline that could carry over into the classroom, college, and their careers. From there, he and Ballentine built an elite sports program that dominated many categories. Today, Mathews-Dickey attracts top athletes from diverse neighborhoods throughout St. Louis. Countless Mathews-Dickey athletes became professional players, and even more of them are successful doctors, lawyers, engineers, teachers, and leaders in their respective industries.

Remembered for his political connections, civil rights, and youth advocacy, Mr. Mathews was a respected leader. He won many awards, and Mathews-Dickey was nationally recognized as a leader among youth organizations by several presidents and vice presidents. President Ronald Reagan presented Mr. Mathews with the Presidential Citizens Medal in 1982. Later, President Bill Clinton recognized Mathews-Dickey as a 21st Century Learning Center. The awards were plentiful, and Mr. Mathews called civic, business, and political leaders his dear friends and supporters. Mr. Mathews connected with Club youth and was a familiar face to members. He loved sharing his mantras with youngsters - the famous Rs – Respect, Restraint, and Responsibility. We miss Mr. Mathews. However, Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater St. Louis will keep the history and his legacy alive.

BETHALTO CLUB

2022 Program Allocation Percentages


Thanks to the generous support of our funding organizations and individual donors, we can afford to help each and every kid achieve their greatest potential, regardless of their family's financial circumstances.




