





### **Program Highlights**




Hero for Youth




### Youth of the Year

It is a signature national youth recognition program that celebrates recipients' contributions to their family, school, community, and Boys & Girls Club. The winner was announced under the Big Top at the carnival-themed Great Futures Gala, the largest fundraising event for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater St. Louis, which raised \$660,000 for Club kids and teens!

Zhariah, age 17, is a senior at Metro Academic and Classical High School and has been a Club member for two years. In addition to winning the Youth of the Year title and representing the Club as a Teen Ambassador, she received the Michael & Wanda DeHaven \$5,000 Scholarship, a celebratory dinner courtesy of the Saint Louis Club, and a car sponsored by Frank Leta Honda!

Zhariah's Great Future plans are to pursue higher education and become a Biomedical Engineer. She enjoys the Club's SMART Girls program the most and is thankful for the support of staff and programming that has helped boost her self-confidence. ### Tom Sullivan and Dennis Morgan Celebrate Longevity at BGC

### 50 Years of Service



Statistics show when caring adults lead youth, they thrive in supportive environments. For the past 50 years, Tom Sullivan has positively influenced thousands of youth at Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater St. Louis Mathews-Dickey Club. Tom Sullivan received the National Service to Youth Award for 50 years of service.

Sullivan's love for sports and baseball led him to Mathews-Dickey Boys & Girls Clubs. In 1973, he started as a Junior Commissioner in the Earn & Learn Program, where he was the Administrator for 75 baseball teams and coaches. Sullivan also scheduled approximately 50 umpires.

Sullivan said the key to his longevity is a sense of accomplishment that comes with working with youth. "Being able to save the lives of young people and guide them on a positive route by acquiring an education and becoming productive citizens has always been rewarding."

Tom Sullivan's impact on the development and expansion of Mathews-Dickey is significant. His early days were marked by his supervision of the construction of the current Mathews-Dickey 68,000-square-foot building, a space that includes an upper gym, game room, offices, classrooms, a pool, and the Girls Annex. His work on the James "Cool Papa" Bell Stadium and the football field, as well as the restoration of three sites in 2008 and 2009 totaling \$2 million, further underscore his contributions. His close collaboration with co-founder Martin Mathews is a testament to his dedication.

Sullivan has played many roles and served in various capacities over the years. He said, "The greatest lesson I have learned from working here is always be willing to give of yourself because that is why we were placed here on this earth to help others." Sullivan puts his best foot forward every day where you can find him working beyond 5 o'clock. "My desire has always been to give back to children like adults invested in me."

BGCSTL President Dr. Flint Fowler says, "Tom's leadership with the legacy organization is pivotal as the Boys & Girls Clubs continues to expand and fulfill our mission."

Club Alumni are a testament to the success of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater St. Louis, and in turn, can help us mold and develop the youth of today to be tomorrow's community leaders.

## The St. Louis Internship Program Provides Employers a Pipeline to Future Leaders!



The word is out that the St. Louis Internship Program (SLIP) is a beacon of hope, support, assistance, and inspiration for high students.



More than 250 students applied to be a part of the program, drawn by the unique opportunity it offers. SLIP provides students with employment preparation training and places them in an eightweek paid summer internship. These internships not only prepare them for corporate and community leadership but also teach them how to plan and finance their post-secondary education and career goals. The success of SLIP is a collaborative effort. Over 95 percent of SLIP interns have graduated high school and attended college or post-secondary training programs. Many SLIP graduates are now thriving in professional careers with sponsoring companies, including Boeing, AT&T, St. Louis Public Schools, and US Bank, to name a few.




