NBA Champion Jayson Tatum

A Slam Dunk for Boys & Girls Club Youth: Jayson Tatum Renovates Mathews- Dickey Club Gym

Thanks to the basketball superstar, members of the BGCSTL Mathews-Dickey Club were thrilled to see the newly refurbished lower-level Jayson Tatum 2K Foundation gym. The club members erupted in cheers as the NBA star entered the gym.

Jayson Tatum, the star forward with the Boston Celtics, is all about giving back. The late Kobe Bryant, former L.A. Lakers shooting guard and forward, was Tatum's mentor and the person he first trained with when Tatum entered the NBA. So, Tatum has not only emulated Bryant in his moves and mentality, but in his philanthropic spirit. Tatum especially loves to give back in his hometown of St. Louis.

On Tuesday afternoon, local kids walked into the north St. Louis gym to discover it was renovated and refurbished, thanks to Jayson Tatum.

And then, as they processed the moment, Tatum himself walked in.

The jaw of 9-year-old Jamar Beverly dropped impossibly fast and improbably low – and with his hands to his face, he made the image from “The Scream” painting look like it was just a minor squawk.

“I never met a basketball superstar before,” Beverly explained after a group picture with the NBA champion and Olympic gold medalist, “so it’s kind of the best thing ever in my life that’s ever happened.”

One of Tatum's childhood dreams was to appear on the cover of NBA 2K, a video game that he played. When the Celtics won the 2024 NBA Championship, Tatum earned his spot on the cover of NBA 2K25. Coupled with that honor, Tatum was able to team with 2K Foundations, which is the charitable arm for the video game franchise. Part of their charitable work? Renovating basketball courts. This partnership culminated in the renovation and refurbishment of the Mathews-Dickey Club, formerly known as The Boys & Girls Club of Greater St. Louis, where Tatum himself played as a kid.

St. Louis Internship Program

Building Futures, One Internship at a Time



The St. Louis Internship Program (SLIP) continues to be a beacon of hope, support, and inspiration for high school students across the region. This year, more than 300 students applied, eager to take part in the unique opportunity the program provides.

SLIP equips students with essential employment preparation training and matches them with eight-week paid summer internships. These experiences not only build workplace readiness and leadership skills but also empower students to plan and finance their post-secondary education and career paths.

The results speak for themselves: over 95% of SLIP interns have graduated from high school and gone on to college or post-secondary training programs. Today, many program alumni are thriving in professional careers with sponsoring companies such as Accenture, Boeing, and Brown & Crouppen, among many others. We're grateful for new partnerships with the City of St.

Louis FREE Driver's Education Classes, IBEW Local 4 Skills Trade Exploration Program (STEP), and the SLU AHEC Pipeline to Medicine Program. Eleven members achieved perfect attendance during the six-week skills-based program. The SLU AHEC Pipeline to Medicine Program taught students everything from how to take blood pressure to recognizing a stroke victim and much more. The graduation ceremony included receiving their white coat, a pin, and a completion certificate.

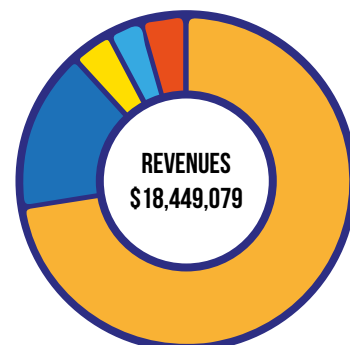

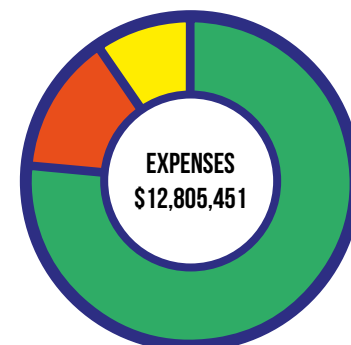

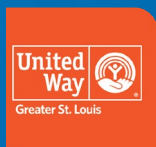
